Centre Stage Inc partners with schools to bring engaging performing arts education directly to students. Through classes, workshops, and full musical theatre productions, students develop confidence, creativity, collaboration, and performance skills.

Our programs introduce students to vocal music, acting, dance, and musical theatre, taught by experienced instructors in a supportive and engaging environment.

Most programs take place on-site at the participating school, though alternate locations can be arranged at the school's expense.

Centre Stage programs are currently designed for Elementary and Middle School students.

Centre Stage Inc is dedicated to providing high-quality performing arts education and musical theatre opportunities for young people. Through instruction in voice, acting, and dance, students build confidence, creativity, communication skills, and teamwork while developing real stage experience.

Our Program Offerings

Before & After School Performing Arts Classes

- Weekly or biweekly classes
- Select one performing arts discipline to focus on through group classes:
 - Show Choir
 - Acting for TV & Film
 - Industry Workshop
 - Improv/ Into to Acting
 - Dance for the Stage
 - Hip Hop/ Jazz
- Maximum class sizes vary depending on the discipline
- Optional performance available for additional fee

After School Main Stage Musical Theatre Program

- Weekly to biweekly rehearsals
- Choose between appx. 15 popular musicals
- Students rehearse and perform a full musical theatre production at their school
- Appx 20–40 total hours of rehearsal
- Base pricing applies to classes up to 35 students; additional fees may apply for larger class sizes.
- Tech crew available for additional fee

During School Performing Arts Rotation Program

- Weekly or biweekly classes
- Students rotate through voice, acting, and dance disciplines.
- Not a performance-based class.

During School General Music Program

- Weekly or biweekly classes
- Build vocal skills & musical confidence through singing, movement, & music activities.
- Optional performance for additional fee

Program Focus Areas



General Music & Show Choir

Vocal Performance

Price: \$250 p/hour up to 65 students

Students develop vocal technique, musicality, and confidence while learning songs from a variety of styles, including Broadway and popular music.



Acting for TV & Film, Industry Workshop, & Improv

Acting

Price: \$250 p/hour up to 35 students

Students explore character, storytelling, and stage presence through acting exercises, scene work, and performance activities.



Dance for the Stage, Hip Hop, Jazz, & Tap

Dance

Price: \$250 p/hour up to 35 students

Students learn choreography and movement inspired by Broadway or contemporary dance styles while building coordination and stage confidence.



Musical Theatre

\$30,000 base rate on 35 students

Students develop skills in singing, acting, and movement while working collaboratively to perform a complete musical production.

Centre Stage offers a range of performing arts programs designed to fit the needs of each school, including individual classes, rotating arts experiences, and full musical theatre productions. Programs can be customized to align with school schedules, class sizes, student populations, and desired outcomes.

Detailed Class Pages

General Music: *During School as full-year class or Program Rotation*

Students explore the fundamentals of vocal music while developing musical confidence and performance skills.

Instruction includes:

- Vocal techniques and voice strengthening
- Beginning music theory
- Musical exploration using popular music styles, educational selections, holiday themes, or current topics
- Movement and dance integrated with music selections
- Hand-eye coordination and physical engagement through music

Schools may choose to add a public performance opportunity for an additional fee.

Show Choir: *Before & After School Program*

A performance-based class where students learn to prepare and perform vocals and choreography from contemporary and Broadway musical selections.

Students develop:

- Vocal performance techniques
- Choreography integration with music
- Stage presence and expression
- Text interpretation
- Facial and body expression
- Ensemble performance skills

Centre Stage provides instructional materials including music, lyrics, worksheets, and curriculum content.

Dancing for the Stage: *During School Program Rotation, or Before & After School*

Available in Broadway Dance, Hip Hop/Jazz, or a combined styles format.

Students build dance technique and performance skills through Broadway-inspired choreography, contemporary movement styles, or a combination of both.

Classes focus on:

- Dance technique and coordination
- Rhythm, musicality, and movement quality
- Broadway, jazz, and hip hop choreography styles
- Stage presence, confidence, and performance energy

Schools may choose to add a public performance opportunity for an additional fee.

Acting for the TV & Film: *Before & After School Program*

Students interested in television and film acting learn practical industry skills from Romel De Silva, a working professional in the entertainment industry.

Students learn:

- How to prepare for TV and film auditions
- Self-tape techniques
- Performance skills for camera acting

Schools may choose to add a public performance opportunity for an additional fee.

Industry Workshop: *Before & After School Program*

Students learn about the process of entering the entertainment industry, including:

- Understanding pathways into television and film
- How actors obtain representation
- Steps to securing an agent

Improv/ Intro to Acting: *During School Program Rotation, or Before & After School*

Improv classes focus on creativity, spontaneity, and confidence through theatre games and interactive exercises.

Students learn to:

- Think creatively and quickly
- Collaborate with peers
- Build confidence on and off stage
- Strengthen communication skills

Schools may choose to add a public performance opportunity for an additional fee.

Main Stage Musical Theatre Program: *After School Program*

The Musical Theatre Jr Workshop gives students the opportunity to perform in a fully staged musical production at their school. Students are cast in a show and rehearse regularly with Centre Stage instructors 1–2 times per week. Total rehearsal time typically ranges from 20–40 hours depending on role. Parent involvement is required.

This program includes New York performance rights, directing, choreography, vocal direction, rehearsal leadership, scripts, select costumes/props, and programs. Rehearsals and performances take place on-site, with an optional tech team available for an additional fee.

Available productions may vary based on performance rights availability and licensing approval: The Addams Family Jr., All Shook Up Jr., Annie Jr., Freaky Friday Young Performers' Edition, 13 Jr., Bye Bye Birdie Young Performers Edition, Disney's Finding Nemo Jr., Disney's High School Musical Jr., Honk!
